Pastor's Letter

As February is Black History Month, I thought I'd share the story of the first

African American to be ordained as a Lutheran pastor in the United States: Jehu Jones, Jr. The majority of the story quoted below comes from an article in the New Jersey Synod by Michael Linderman, with some supplements from a passage in the book *Stories from Global Lutheranism*, both drawing on a biography written by Karl E. Johnson, Jr. and Joseph A. Romeo.

"In 1832, Jehu Jones Jr. was the first African American to be ordained as a Lutheran pastor in the United States. His story is one filled with inspiration and frustration. Although he found vocal support among white Lutherans for his ministry among African Americans on behalf of the Pennsylvania Synod of the Lutheran Church, he never received the material support that he needed to establish his congregation in a proper building. Over the years of his pastoral ministry, he lost the mortgage on the church building that he fought so hard for, and the Synod docked his salary to help repay the church's debts.

"Jones was born a free Black in Charleston, South Carolina, in 1786, and became a successful tailor. Originally an Episcopalian, he and his family joined St. John's Lutheran Church in Charleston in 1818, where all of his children were baptized. Jones later became part of a local effort to send free Blacks to Liberia, on the West Coast of Africa. Jones' pastor supported his efforts to become a missionary to the group, and in 1832, sent Jones to New York to be considered for ordination [due to a state law that forbade black men to be ordained for ministry]. The New York Synod ordained him right away at their meeting in New York, but he missed joining the group to Liberia because of a racist law that banned free Blacks from entering South Carolina. [The law stated that free blacks who left South Carolina and returned could be enslaved.] Barred from returning to South Carolina and leaving with the

group for Liberia, he [fled for the north and] had his family join him in Philadelphia, and started working on behalf of the German Evangelical Synod of Pennsylvania as a mission developer among the African American community there. In 1834, he reported to the Synod that he had visited 2781 families, of whom 163 were sick.

"That same year, Jones took out a mortgage to purchase two lots in Philadelphia, at \$375 each, and build St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church. Construction was completed, but the debt was significant. He undertook several fundraising trips to white churches in neighboring states, and he appealed repeatedly over the course of seven years to the Synod for financial support. Unmoved by his situation, and unwilling to support the vision of a permanent established black Lutheran church in Philadelphia, the synod sold the church building and cut his \$100 annual salary in half to pay off the debt. Despite these setbacks and the financial ruin he endured, Jones faithfully continued in his calling as a Lutheran pastor until his death in 1852."

"Rev. Jones's experience of obstacles about who is Lutheran and what Lutheran leadership looks like was not unique...Lutherans in previous centuries had also fought over questions of leadership, inclusion, and social justice. In the setting of American slavery, however, these already-challenging issues bore the additional weight of racist ideas and dehumanizing social structures, which Pastor Jones personally worked under and fought against. His life and work show both a legacy of hardship due to intolerance and the possibilities that can arise through people of courageous faith."

Martin Luther was once famously ordered to recant his reforming ideas. The story goes that Luther responded, "Here I stand; I can do no other." When once asked about why he didn't just switch to some other denomination, Rev. Jones replied that he "could be nothing but Lutheran."

MCEF News

The month of December saw a lot of activity in the OSS with 147 visits for food, clothing and linens. 212 bags of food were received by clients with an additional 109 bags of an extra bag of items for a holiday meal of the clients choosing. 76 clients received clothing and 63 received linens. Financial assistance was received by 11 households and 120 rides were provided for seniors to keep doctor appointments and other necessary services.

Current pantry needs include condiments (ketchup, mustard, mayo, pancake syrup), canned greens (collards, spinach, mixed) and toothpaste and brushes (February is Dental Health Month).

The new brochure highlighting the activities of 2024 will be soon available. Thank you for your continued support of your neighbors in need.

Meet Messiah's Mutual Ministry Team

The Mutual Ministry Team's primary function, according to the constitution and by-laws, "is to aid the pastor in effective congregational ministry." This takes a couple of shapes:

First, the mutual ministry team is there to receive all types of feedback from congregation members. They can also answer questions about the ministries of the pastor to the congregation. Second, they are a group that is available for the pastor to go to for counsel, or to consult as a sounding board. In short, they "assist the pastor in developing and maintaining a healthy working relationship" with the congregation.
