Pastor's Letter

with Jesus." I guess I've always had a little trouble with how that works, or how it looks. In this month of April we will hear once again the stories of Jesus's palm-strewn entry into Jerusalem, as well as his betrayal and arrest. We will hear the story of the last supper and the new commandment to love one another as Jesus loves us. And we will hear the stories of how Jesus was mocked, beaten, abandoned, denied, crucified, and buried. We will hear the story about God's ultimate response to sin, which culminates in Jesus alive and raised, yet still wounded; of the tomb empty and the news spreading. And after all of this, Jesus ascends once more into heaven, sending us the Holy Spirit to counsel and guide and equip us, we who are the body of Christ, the church of Christ in this world, until his return.

It's that last part that gives me trouble with the "personal relationship with Jesus." Jesus isn't here, in the flesh, and hasn't been for around two thousand years. I admire many long-deceased authors and artists and actors and athletes and thinkers and theologians. They have shaped me and inspired me. But I don't have a personal relationship with them – that's a two-way street. I can read Jesus's teachings in the Bible, I can see the Spirit working throughout history and all around me today. But that's not the same thing as a personal relationship, either. What does that even mean?

I taught a workshop at the EPIC event in March that has maybe shed a little light on this for me. The workshop was about how regular interaction with the Bible, either through individual reading and devotion or group Bible study and conversation, shapes us. It forms our biblical identity. I love leading discussions on the Bible, and hearing what other people learn from Scripture. To prepare for the workshop I had to take

a step back and examine what it is I actually do to prepare for and lead such a conversation. Why do I do the things I do? Here are a couple of the insights I discovered, and shared, for the workshop: "Bible studies that help shape our Christian identities also try their best to *model* Christian community. You encourage questions. You invite discussion. You affirm what people share. You show that it's ok not to have all the answers. You pray at the beginning, or end, or both, of the time together. You incorporate what people have shared into that prayer. They are heard. They are loved. That experience that their sharing and contributions are needed by others... You support everyone and trust that it's ok to venture into challenging topics sometimes, especially if a lot of trust has been built up together. You invite but don't force the more shy participants to share. You give thanks that everyone is there. You ask people what they see and hear and wonder and think about what you are talking about. You recognize that there are different learning styles... If our identity is rooted in the Bible, in its themes of grace and neighbor-love and the body of Christ and acceptance and forgiveness and then some more grace, then we'd best be demonstrating that in our conversations."

"These conversations, discussions, and studies, are not an end unto themselves... [I]t's not just to learn facts; it is to be open to being shaped biblically and to be more attuned to God. And that identity naturally leads to mission – to the sharing of the good news, in word and deed, in your lives. What you learn, and the way you are shaped, should have an impact on your relationships, your priorities, your whole life. And then you bring those lived experiences back to the discussion and the shaping continues, for yourself and others."

So: maybe *that's* what it means to have a "personal relationship with Jesus." To immerse yourself in God's Word, every day, and to interact with others who are doing the same, and to live out your faith. Until you are shaped by this Word, and by God's grace, more and more Christlike.

MCEF News

February was a busy month, especially considering that many days the OSS was closed and rides were canceled due to weather. There were 134 visits to the OSS for food with 185 bags of food received by clients and 56 clients assisted with clothing and 21 assisted with linens. Senior rides provided 94 rides to seniors for doctor appointments and essential services. Financial assistance was provided to 6 households. MCEF assists the backpack program in Mechanicsville schools by supplementing items for the 6 meals provided to 123 children at risk each weekend.

The closets are in transition to spring and summer clothing. The excess of winter items is being funnelled to other groups who are in need. Needs include girls' undies and socks, all sizes. Linen closet needs full and queen size sheets in good condition. Food pantry is in need of canned meats, Spam, tuna, chicken, stew, etc. All donations are greatly appreciated. Thank you.


